BMFTR requirements

The following list provides information on key issues until the upcoming publication of BMFTR's Guideline for the funding of research projects on the topic 'Preparing for Tomorrow – Societies and Strategies in Times of Transition' as part of the international T-AP Call.

Maximum funding per BMFTR funded German partner project	400,000 Euros
Project duration	24-36 months (identical with T-AP Call instructions , section 1.5)
Type of research and themes to be funded	Identical with T-AP call scope
The following potential partners from Germany are eligible for BMFTR funding	As a general rule, higher education institutions, non-university research institutions, museums, libraries, and archives that can make research contributions and meet the funding purpose and the funding requirements (see also FAQ below). These institutions must be located in Germany or are required to have an organisation located in Germany serving the non-economic activities of the funding recipient.
Object of funding	Individual research projects (rather than consortia) at German institutions that are part of international T-AP consortia
Knowledge transfer or knowledge exchange	Beyond publications, conference talks and other activities that communicate findings to academic audiences, publications or other activities to enable knowledge transfer or knowledge exchange are expected
Eligible costs	As a general rule, grants can be provided to cover expenditure and costs for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staffing expenditure/costs • Student and/or research assistants • Award of contracts • Material expenses • Funding to hold or participate in workshops and conferences, and for effective publication of the project results • Travel expenses
Disclaimer on budget items	DLR-PT does not give clearance for the budget items at the stage of an eligibility check. A comprehensive assessment will be conducted only at the stage when proposals have been selected for funding. PIs from German institutions applying for BMFTR funding whose consortium proposals have been selected for funding will be asked to submit a formal full application for BMFTR funding ('förmlicher Vollertrag') via the electronic proposal system „easy-Online“.
